ICT:

- The pupils will continue to engage in the WYRED Project focusing on their involvement in the digital society.
- The pupils will research the World Cup football tournament.
- Use spreadsheets to record race times for our buggies.
- As always explore how the pupils can stay safe on-line.

Literacy:

We will concentrate on Explanation Writing this term focusing on the significance of connectives and developing an appreciation of the significance of ordered steps.

In Reading the children will:

- Become aware of the various forms of language
- Identify and describe the features and relationships of a fiction text
- Identify the sequence of events in a text
- Identify and describe character's features and relationships
- Recognise similarities and differences in events and/or characters using evidence cited in two or more texts
- To analyse plot structure of a text

We ask you to **continue** to stress the importance of reading in your child's life by encouraging them to read a minimum of 30 minutes each day. A significant number of children have reached their target in Accelerated Reading over the previous 2 terms and we hope that each and every child will strive to reach this target this term.

Numeracy:

In Numeracy we will focus on:

- Understanding and using index notation
 - Becoming familiar with the Chinese Tangram
- Using the 4 operations to solve more complex word problems and puzzles involving numbers and measures
- Research and record statistics and use spreadsheets to perform calculations.

Irish:

Irish classes will continue with Mr. O'Farrell on a Thursday. He is very happy with the progress the children have made in learning the language and we all hope that they will be able to develop these skills further at their next schools.

Music:

Tin Whistle will also continue with Ms. Mc Bride on a Wednesday morning. It is very important that you assist by encouraging your child to come fully prepared with tin whistle and music notes.

The choir will compete in the Feis on Friday 20th April. Good Luck to them and Mrs Kelly who has put so much work into this competition.
